



Effective classroom structures promote learning. Teachers can have the best lesson in the world, but if students cannot navigate the classroom, anticipate the flow of the class, or have an understanding of what to do when they will not learn nearly as much as they could. In this session, participants will:

- examine how arrangement and routines impact student engagement and learning;
- contemplate ways organizational planning for the physical space can improve the class flow;




