About the Series

"One Size Fits All" is a phrase that we are all familiar with but may find challenging to avoid when designing instruction. All educators want what is best for their students: understanding, independence, success, and perseverance. Standards-Based learning provides transparency to your students, their families, and your administration in order to communicate clearly what students have learned and need to practice.

Tuesday, October 17, 2023 Learning Centers & Station Teaching






