

Online Teaching Checklist

The important stuff:

- I began with [measurable and observable objective\(s\)](#)
- My content is [accessible](#)
 - Videos have captions – [how to use automatic captioning in YouTube](#)
 - Images have [Alt Tags](#)
 - I've reviewed my IEPs for modifications and accommodations
- All hyperlinks work
- My [hyperlinks are accessible](#) (my link is descriptive) – this is Julie's biggest pet peeves 😊
- I've tested content on different devices and browsers
 - Tablet
 - Smart phone
 - PC/Mac
 - Different browsers (Chrome, Firefox, Safari)
- My content has [good contrast](#) (remember – NO YELLOW TEXT)
- I only used color for emphasis, not meaning
- I removed underlined text, except for hyperlinks because this can be confusing
- I used bulleted lists, numbered lists for steps, tables, or visuals in my directions ([snipping tool](#))
- I have one place for students to submit assignments (not email)
- My content is socially responsible
 - Photos and videos represent my student body
 - I've worked on [reducing implicit bias](#)

The good stuff:

- I have a social emotional check-in activity(ies)
- I have a Q & A place for all questions
- My lessons are [Universally Designed](#):
 - including Multiple Means of Representation
 - including Multiple Means of Action and Expression
 - including Multiple Means of Engagement
- My presentations are engaging
 - Chunked into sections (I do, we do, they do)
 - Quickly paced
 - I used emojis, memes, gifs, student work, student pictures, animals (whatever motivates)
- Videos are chunked into 10-minute (or less) segments
- I've included [guided notes](#) for instruction
- I've included checklists or a [rubric](#) for students to self-assess assignments
- I've incorporated peer review as much as possible – [peer review strategies online](#)
- I've incorporated small group discussion (i.e. [break out rooms in zoom](#), [google meet](#))

The fun stuff:

- I've incorporated a game component, such as [Kahoot!](#), [Google Slides activities](#)

- I designed a [choice board](#) for assignments
- I have interactive slides ([Google](#) or [NearPod](#)) to increase student engagement
- We celebrate our accomplishments (i.e. Show-n-Tell, Student of the day)
- We take time [for fun](#) (crazy hat day, bring your pet to class, pick your meme)
